**Most adjectives describe. Often, descriptive adjectives tell *what kind*.**

Examples: race car

What kind of car? race

***A, an, and the* are called limiting adjectives.**

**Some limiting adjectives tell *how many*.**

two shoes

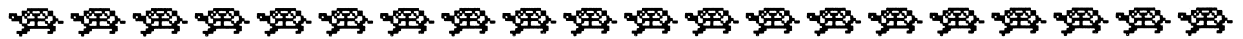
How many? two

many men

How many? many

***NUMBERS* can be limiting adjectives that tell *how many*.**

***Several, some, many, few, no, and any* can be limiting adjectives that tell *how many*.**
